Investment Philosophy

The Harbor Dividend Growth Leaders ETF seeks long-term growth of capital by investing in a relatively concentrated portfolio of primarily large-cap companies with a history or prospect of paying stable or increasing dividends, as determined by the portfolio manager and investment team. The Fund uses a bottom-up process to identify companies that meet its fundamental criteria that evaluates companies on earnings, free cash flow generation, and return-of-capital priorities, including dividends and stock buybacks.

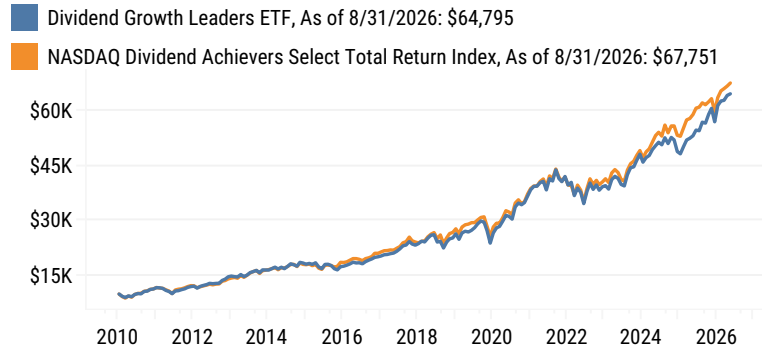

Definitions: Median Market Cap: The median size of the companies in a portfolio or index as measured by the market value of outstanding shares.

Weighted Average Market Capitalization: The average size of the companies in a portfolio or index as measured by the market value of outstanding shares.

Return on Equity (ROE) is a measure of financial performance calculated by dividing net income by shareholders' equity.

All P/E, ROE and P/B statistics are calculated as weighted medians.

Forecasted P/E Ratio: a measure of the P/E (price-to-earnings) ratio using forecasted earnings for the P/E calculation.

The Adjusted Trailing P/E (price-to-earnings) Ratio is the closing stock price divided by the sum of the last 12 months actual EPS.

Earnings per share (EPS) is the portion of a company's profit allocated to each outstanding share.

EPS Growth Rate is calculated by subtracting the initial EPS from the final EPS and dividing the change in EPS by the initial EPS.

% EPS Growth - Past 3 Year: Earnings per share refers to the bottom-line measure of a company's profitability defined as net income divided by the number of outstanding shares.

The Est 3-5 Yr EPS Growth (%) is the estimated growth of earnings per share over the next 3-5 years, using pre-calculated mean long-term EPS growth rate estimates, which are calculated using each individual broker's methodology, from FactSet, First Call, I/B/E/S Consensus, and Reuters. Forward looking estimates may not come to pass.

The Price/Book (price-to-book) Ratio evaluates a firm's market value relative to its book value.

Alpha: Alpha is the risk-adjusted excess return of an investment relative to the return of a benchmark index.

Beta: Beta is a measure of systematic risk, or the sensitivity of a fund to movements in the benchmark. A beta of 1 implies that the expected movement of a fund's return would match that of the benchmark used to measure beta.

Beta is a rolling three year, unless the Fund has a track record of less than three years, in which case it is a rolling one year.

R-squared: R-squared measures the proportion of a fund's or portfolio's movements that can be explained by movements in a benchmark index. For example, an R-squared of 0.8 indicates that 80% of the fund's movements can be explained by the benchmark's movements.

Standard Deviation: Standard deviation in a fund's performance is a statistical measure that quantifies the volatility of a fund's returns over a specific period. It indicates how much the returns deviate from the average, with higher values suggesting greater volatility and potentially higher risk.

Morningstar: The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or “star rating”, is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product’s monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The Morningstar Rating does not include any adjustment for sales loads. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods.

The Morningstar Medalist Rating™ is the summary expression of Morningstar’s forward-looking analysis of investment strategies as offered via specific vehicles using a rating scale of Gold, Silver, Bronze, Neutral, and Negative. The Medalist Ratings indicate which investments Morningstar believes are likely to outperform a relevant index or peer group average on a risk-adjusted basis over time. Investment products are evaluated on three key pillars (People, Parent, and Process) which, when coupled with a fee assessment, forms the basis for Morningstar’s conviction in those products’ investment merits and determines the Medalist Rating they’re assigned. Pillar ratings take the form of Low, Below Average, Average, Above Average, and High. Pillars may be evaluated via an analyst’s qualitative assessment (either directly to a vehicle the analyst covers or indirectly when the pillar ratings of a covered vehicle are mapped to a related uncovered vehicle) or using algorithmic techniques. Vehicles are sorted by their expected performance into rating groups defined by their Morningstar Category and their active or passive status. When analysts directly cover a vehicle, they assign the three pillar ratings based on their qualitative assessment, subject to the oversight of the Analyst Rating Committee, and monitor and reevaluate them at least every 14 months. When the vehicles are covered either indirectly by analysts or by algorithm, the ratings are assigned monthly.
